

Recommended Bilingual Books in English and Spanish

The following books are excellent examples of what to look for in bilingual texts for your students. Literary and engaging, they either present English and Spanish on the same page or have many Spanish words and phrases woven into the English text. Such books are important scaffolds for English language learners, especially for those who are already literate in their first language. They improve and inspire both reading and writing at all levels of language acquisition. When learners see and hear words they know in their first language with an accompanying translation, their transition to speaking, reading, and writing English is easier and more meaningful and comprehensible. Often, the most useful bilingual texts will be the ones you write with your own students. (See *Teaching Essentials*, p. 10.)

The titles are listed alphabetically and are loosely grouped by grade level ranges. Keep in mind that a book recommended for the intermediate grades may also be appropriate as a read aloud in the primary grades.
